

## Veterans can request DD-214s Online



ST. LOUIS— The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) in St. Louis has a new electronic method for Veterans to obtain copies of their discharge papers. Official known as DD Form 214 or DD-214s, the documents can be requested at <http://vetrecs.archives.gov/>. NPRC designed the new online system to provide better service on these requests by eliminating the records center's mail-room processing time.

Individuals other than veterans or their next-of-kin must complete Standard Form 180, Request Pertaining to Military Records, which also can be downloaded from the Web site.

NPRC archives millions of military personnel, health records of discharged and deceased veterans of all services during the 20th century. Records prior to National Archives in Washington, D.C.

NPRC also stores medical treatment records of retirees from all services, as well as records for dependents and other persons treated at naval medical facilities. Information from the records is made available upon written request (with signature and date) to the extent allowed by law.

## Some Statistics Regarding Vietnam Veterans

Confusion resins when it comes to numbers and the Vietnam War. Listed below are some figures from VFW Magazine that may help sort out fact from fiction in many media reports.

Of the 2.6 million, between 1 & 1.6 million (40-60 %) either fought in combat, provided close combat support or were at least fairly regularly exposed to enemy attack.

Amputation or crippling wounds to the lower extremities were 300 percent higher than in WWII and 70 percent higher than in Korea. Multiple amputations occurred at the rate of 18.4 % compared to 5.7 % in WWII.

Missing in Action: 2,338  
Prisoners of War: 766 (1145 died in captivity)

**Draftees vs Volunteers**  
25 % (648,500) of total forces in country were draftees. 66% of U.S. armed forces members were drafted during WWII  
Draftees accounted for 30.4 % (17,725) of combat deaths in Vietnam

Reservists killed: 5,977  
National Guard: 6,140 served: 101 died

**Race and Ethnic Background**  
88.4 % of the men who actually served in Vietnam were Caucasian; 10.6% (275,000) were black; 1% belonged to other races

86.3 percent of the men who died in Vietnam were Caucasian (includes Hispanics); 12.5 percent (7,241) were black: 1.2 percent belonged to other races.

### In Uniform and In Country

Vietnam Vets: 9.7 percent of their generation.

9,087,000 military personnel served on active duty during the Vietnam era (Aug. 5, 1964– May 7, 1975)

8,744,000 personnel were on active duty during the war (Aug. 5, 1964—May 7, 1975)

3,403,100 (including 514,300 off-shore) personnel served in the SE Asia Theater (Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, flight crews based in Thailand, and sailors in adjacent South China Sea waters.

2,594,000 personnel served within the borders of South Vietnam Jan. 1, 1965—March 28, 1973

Another 50,000 men served in Vietnam between 1960 & 1964

7,484 women (83.5 % were nurses) served in Vietnam.

Peak troop strength in Vietnam: 543,482 (April 30, 1969)

### Casualties:

Hostile deaths: 47,359

Non-hostile deaths: 10,797

Total: 58,156 (included men formerly classified as MIA and Mayaguez casualties). 27 other men have died off wounds, bringing the total to 58,183.

61 percent of the men killed were 21 years old or younger.

Highest state death rate: West Virginia—84.1 (national average 58.9 for every 100,000 males in 1970)

Wounded: 303,704—153,329 hospitalized + 150,375 injured who required no hospital care.

Severely disabled: 75,000—23,214; 100% disabled: 5,283

lost limbs; 1,081 sustained multiple amputations.

Our Association is open to all current and former 9<sup>th</sup> Engineers. Contacts are being developed with the 9<sup>th</sup> Engineer Support Battalion in Okinawa to form better interaction with the "new breed".

On a sad note, it is my duty to announce the resignation of Paul Roy, our long time treasurer, from his position in the Association. Paul has cited personal reasons that he is unable to continue. We wish him all the best in the future and hope to see him at upcoming reunions. In an online business meeting held after we were notified by Paul, a vote was taken and Eric Kenney was unanimously elected as current treasurer until the next full membership meeting at the '07 reunion. Please see the attached treasurer's report submitted by Eric, upon the transfer of funds. Ray Alston was elected by unanimous vote to fill Eric's vacated board member position. These appointments and votes will be valid until the next full membership meeting.

Eric and Cathie Kenney have advised that membership cards and dues letters will be sent out in blocks of 50 at a time. Since I have "inside" connections, I have already gotten mine and they look great, Eric is back at his usual outstanding dedication to the Association. From Eric's treasurer's report you can see that we hold close to \$4,000 in inventory in our PX, physically maintained by Ray Alston.

In conversations with Ray and Eric, to improve the website and reduce our inventory to a more manageable level we will be offering online purchases of our "px" gear by credit card directly on the site. Not only will we be able to buy gear, we will be able to register and pay on line our reunion fees, dues and afford people the opportunity to donate to the scholarship fund directly. These sales will not affect our non-profit status, as any profits made from the sales are used 100% by the scholarship fund. Also any applicants to the scholarship awards will be able to fill out secure forms on line and have the data submitted via a secure and safe form.

"Doc" Finch was elected as Vice President and now we have the squids represented within the Association. Doc is a professional at helping with Veteran's affairs. God bless him, that's what he did for 30 years and has received numerous awards for his service with veterans and their families. My hat goes off to Frenchy, always in there with a smile on his face. Ray Alston is another of the unsung heroes of the worker bees. Hats off to both of you.

Bob Nilsson continues to work with the wounded vets coming through Bethesda Naval Hospital. He presented a plaque that was purchased at the 2006 reunion by Bill Hocart, it now hangs in the combat wounded hallway, showing the support and thoughts of the 9<sup>th</sup> Engineers Association to our wounded "Marine Family". Eric Kenney and I, along with any other Fl., Ga. or vacationing members we can put together will be visiting the VA Hospital in Tampa Fl. this January. We are working through contacts from "Frenchy" Roberge and Bob Nilsson to specifically contact patients known to them, as well as an overall visit to the wards. If anyone will be in the area in January, and would like to join us please contact Eric Kenney for specific dates and times.

As some of you may know, due to being shorthanded with postings to Iraq and other commitments globally, our local "Toys for Tots" has been drastically reduced in size and scope solely for lack of manpower. We have established a donation point at the Fort Lauderdale West Marine mega store and are collecting donated new unwrapped toys for the local Marines to distribute to needy children for the holidays. West Marine has posted a notice that the drop off point was established by the "9<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion Association" and Association personnel will collect and deliver the toys collected to the main Marine Corps office in Hialeah, FL.
